The ARRL Field Day is the biggie for June! Though it is not technically a contest, it sure feels like one with all the frantic band activity and quick exchanges. It is the most popular on-the-air event held annually in the United States and Canada.

Here are the key details for Field Day 2024: ARRL Field Day 2024 will take place on June 22-23, starting at 1800UTC on Saturday and ending at 2059 UTC on Sunday. More than 35,000 radio amateurs will gather with their clubs, groups, or friends to operate from remote locations. The goal is to contact as many stations as possible on various HF bands (160m, 80m, 40m, 20m, 15m, and 10m) and all bands 50 MHz and above. Participants will learn to operate in abnormal situations under less-than-optimal conditions. It is a fantastic opportunity to showcase ham radio's science, skill, and service to our community.

TARS will be operating four stations from the Red Cross building during Field Day. Come by as you are able. The conversation is as much fun as the operating. If the weather is stormy or too hot for you, or you have a very limited schedule, fun can still be had by operating your home station. Your exchange will be 1D IN. Be sure to send in your log for the sake of all involved. Let's make the most of this opportunity and go for a big club score!

ARRL Section Manager Election Results

The most recent Section Manager (SM) elections ending on May 10 resulted in two incumbent SMs being reelected for another 2-year term. Both will continue with the work that they have been doing in their Sections.

In the Northern Florida Section, Scott Roberts, KK4ECR, held a lead over challenger James Kvochick, K8JK. This will be Roberts second term as SM. The vote count for the election was 657 for Roberts and 308 for Kvochick.

In the Indiana Section, incumbent Bob Burns, AK9R, defeated challenger Brian Jenks, W9BGJ. The vote count ended with Burns receiving 684 votes and Jenks receiving 161 votes.

Congratulations to both returning Section Managers.

Kids Day is designed to give on-the-air experience to young people and foster interest in getting a license of their own. It is also intended to give older hams a chance to share their station and love for amateur radio with the children in their lives. Kids Day always runs from 1800 UTC through 2359 UTC, and you operate as much or as little as you like. The suggested frequencies for Kids Day are:

10 Meters: 28.350 to 28.400 MHz 12 Meters: 24.960 to 24.980 MHz 15 Meters: 21.360 to 21.400 MHz 17 Meters: 18.140 to 18.145 MHz 20 Meters: 14.270 to 14.300 MHz 40 Meters: 7.270 to 7.290 MHz 80 Meters: 3.740 to 3.940 MHz You can also use your favorite local repeater with permission of the repeater's sponsor. Be sure to observe third-party restrictions when making DX QSOs. All participants are eligible to receive a colorful certificate. You can <u>download this certificate</u> and complete it with the participant's name and date of the contact. Visit <u>Kids Day (arrl.org)</u> for more information.

13 Colonies Special Event

The 13 Colonies Special Event will take place July 1-7, 2024. Operating times are July 1,1300 UTC to July 8, 0400

UTC. Thirteen special call signs will be on the air, each one representing one of the original 13 British colonies that were established in 1607. Three additional bonus call signs will be on the air representing Great Britain, France, and Philadelphia. All HF bands can be used, including the WARC bands, with the exception of 60 meters. Simplex on 2 meters and 6 meters is encouraged. The southeastern stations on the east coast are very close to each other. It will be harder for these states to contact each other so, use of 40-160 meters is encouraged. All modes of operation may be used, including SSB, CW, RTTY, and digital. The mode of operation is up to the individual colony state station. More information about logs, call signs, and QSL certifications can be found at The Annual 13 Colonies Special Event.


